PRINCIPAL NEWS

Thank you to those parents who attended our new parent helper sessions on Tuesday. It was wonderful to see that our classrooms will be enriched by more adult participation.

A reminder to all that anyone who wishes to help within our school must have a Working with Children Check and sign our Child Safe Policy. This is mandated and as such no changes will be made to this policy.

On Friday evening, we ask that those families who are not connected to the Prep/Year 6 buddy program do not arrive at school prior to 7.30pm. This is so that the new prep and six parents have time to establish relationships prior to the beginning of the film night. The film will commence at dusk.

As this is a school event we ask that you remember that we are lucky to be able to have a drink on this night, however if I feel that the drinking is excessive and we are setting poor examples to our children then I will have no alternative but to place a ban on the consumption of alcohol at school events. As my wife tells me remember everything in moderation!

We ask you to pray for those staff who are awaiting the birth of their children, namely Adrianna Bonnacci and Rebecca Ledsam may their children be born healthy.

Next Saturday February 17th, we have our beginning of the school year and Captain's Mass on at 6.00pm. All children who have been selected as captains are asked to wear their school uniforms on this night.

ST JOHN BOSCO'S PRIMARY SCHOOL CLASS PARENT REPRESENTATIVE

At the beginning of each year people are requested to nominate themselves for the role of Classroom Parent Representative. Volunteers show interest to the classroom teacher and reps are chosen in the first couple of weeks. Each class from Prep to Year 6 will have at least one Parent Representative. If more than one person volunteers there can be multiple representatives for a class working together. The function of the Parent Representative is not formally structured and is not meant to be an arduous task.

The purpose of the Parent Representative is to help foster good communication in the school and to assist in the development of school community. It provides another means of uniting the school community and enhances the quality of relationships within the school between teachers, parents and the children.

Ways in which past parent representatives have fostered communication have traditionally included:

- Collecting contact details of members of the class at the beginning of their role (It has been suggested that this can occur with a sign-up sheet at the first parent teacher interview day)
- Circulating email contact details to facilitate members of the class to arrange playdates, catch ups and events
- Meeting with the Class Teacher and discussing the role that the Parent Representative will play that year
- Welcoming new members of the class and their families
- Fostering a supportive community informing people and facilitating the giving of gifts to the teachers or classroom parents on significant occasions (examples include the birth of a child or an end of the year thankyou)
- Organising social events for parents to get to know each other, ideally one per term such as morning teas, or dinners. When held early in the year these events such as dinners can really help parents get to know each other early and can really foster a sense of community
- Actively engaging in the school community. This could be by attending catch ups, attending and encouraging attendance at school events or attending P&F meetings for example
- Where appropriate, communicating parent experiences/suggestions/concerns to staff, board members or principal
