SEASONS PROGRAM 2018 Peer Support For Grief And Loss

We will be looking to start our 2018 Seasons Program soon. The Seasons Program is a peer support group for children who have experienced grief and loss in their lives and wish to work through their feelings and ask those commonly asked questions about their experience. Common reasons for taking part in the program include the death of a loved one, family separation or divorce. The group will meet for 10 sessions and each will be facilitated by myself or Sommer Azzopardi. Students are supported throughout the program by the teacher and their peers as they share their stories, ask questions and listen to each other.

If you think this program would suit your child or children could you please email me or Sommer, including the reason for participating. Once groups are sorted you will be contacted and given further information regarding session days and times.

Ideas for Creating a Growth Mindset Environment at Home Parents Work Towards a Growth Mindset for Themselves

• We can't expect our children to have a growth mindset if we don't have one ourselves. Recognise fixed mindset thinking in yourself and talk yourself into a growth mindset. This can also be done out loud so that your child can hear how you are changing your mindset. For example, you might catch yourself saying "I can't figure out how to fill out this document." Then quickly rephrase it to add, "I think I need to check on the website or call the bank so I can ask some questions, then I am sure I will be able to fill it out accurately."

• Be aware of your own fixed mindset statements such as "I am a terrible cook," "I was never good at math either," or "I wish I could play the piano like you do" (You can, with practice and perseverance!).

 Be aware of blaming genetics for anything - both positive and negative

 Be careful about comparing your kids to their siblings or other kids

• We want our children to enjoy the process of learning not just be successful. Model this concept at home. For example, after a less than desirable outcome trying to bake something challenging, you might say "I really learned a lot making those cookies" rather than "Ugghh, what a waste of time. That as an epic fail. I will never try that recipe again."

ENGLISH NEWS

We hope you have all had the opportunity to read the SJB English information on our new website. It states:

We believe each child learns developmentally and therefore individual learning needs are targeted. Through ongoing assessment we identify the child's strengths and challenges and together with the student we establish personal goals in the areas of reading and writing. Students are encouraged to articulate their goal and explain the steps to achieve their goal.

All students in Years 1 - 6 are currently working with their teacher on a personalised reading goal.

What is a personalised reading goal?

It is the identification of a students' current need in their reading development. In collaboration with the classroom teacher the student is able to articulate the next step in their reading and what they will need to do to achieve this goal. The reading goals will be identified under one of the following headings; accuracy, fluency, comprehension and vocabulary. Many of you will have already been informed of your child's reading goal through Seesaw. Please talk with your children about their reading goal and how they think they can achieve it. A reading goal document will be placed on your child's year level sites page on the SJB website to explain each of the goals and how you can assist your child at home.

Classroom Libraries

Excitement continues to build as we are witnessing children discovering a love of reading across all year levels. You may have noticed within the classroom that all children have a blue book box in which to place all of their current reading materials. The children are encouraged to have a variety of books in their boxes. This may include picture stories, novels, books to practise fluent reading, information books etc. We have been talking to the children about 'Good-fit' books and how they can use the acronym: **I-PICK** Good-fit Books.

I select a book and look it over, inside and out.

Purpose: Why might I want to read it?

Interest: Does it interest me?

Comprehend: Do I understand what I am reading? Know: Do I know most of the words?

We have also been talking to the children about **Reading Stamina** during their independent reading time.

Reading stamina is staying focused on your reading for a long period of time without getting too tired or giving up.

We look forward to sharing in your child's 2018 reading journey and we continue to be deeply appreciative of all that you do at home to support your child in their learning. Many thanks,

I will notify you by Friday 23rd Feb, so there is plenty of time for the registration to be completed.

Registrations are open now and close on Thurs 1st March and there is a non-refundable \$25 application fee.
