### SJB NEW SPELLING APPROACH 2019

In term 4, 2018 all staff attended a professional learning day about SMART spelling with a view to implementing this approach in 2019. This method provides a clear Prep – 6 sequential teaching program where students are explicitly taught spelling patterns, one at a time. Teachers choose a range of words (from simple to complex) and students are then guided to choose from that list, so that individual needs can be met. Teachers start by teaching the meaning of words to expand vocabulary and then break words into syllables, sounds and letter patterns. Providing meaningful feedback to students is a powerful component of this approach to spelling. We will commence this program next week.

### What can you expect?

Your children will bring home a spelling sheet with the words that have been selected from the list - they are asked to practise writing these words 4 times before a spelling test and dictation assessment will be administered on the fifth day. **PLEASE NOTE**: Prep & Year 1 classes will commence the following week.

A parent meeting will be held early in term 2 to explain the SMART spelling approach.

### INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
