#### SAFETY AROUND OUR SCHOOL

All parents are reminded how to use the drop off and pick up pink zone. This zone is not for waiting in.

Carers should always drop off or pick up their child/ren from in this zone:

- •ask your child to head straight to the pick up zone once the bell rings they will then be ready and waiting once you arrive
- •plan to arrive after the bell rings, not before, as you cannot wait in the zone
- remain in your vehicles at all times
- •move forward to join the queue so that other vehicles can get into the zone
- use the hand brake and put the vehicle in park when it is stationary do not double park
- do not park across a pedestrian crossing
- do not undertake a U-turn in close proximity to the school.

Students should:

keep your seat belt on until the vehicle has stopped in the zone

have your school bag and other items in a safe position on the floor and ready for you to take with you when the vehicle has stopped

always get in and out of the vehicle through the safety door (the rear footpath-side door).

#### **MOBILE SCHOOL DENTIST**

We are lucky to have the Mobile School Dentist visiting us from the week of 25th of March. Consent forms were distributed for each child last week. Services will be bulk billed for families who meet the Medicare Child Dental Benefits Schedule. On receipt of the consent form, the school dentist will then verify your eligibility and contact you before seeing your child.

Eligibility is determined through Medicare and the ATO. Generally families with health care cards or in receipt of Family tax benefit are likely to be eligible for a free service. However, this is determined after you have completed the consent form, which includes providing your child's Medicare number. Families who don't meet CDBS criteria can still visit the dental van, however fees will apply.

If you would like your child to visit the mobile school dentist please complete the consent form and return it to school by **Thursday March 14**<sup>th</sup>

Prior to the van visiting, Prep to Year 3 students will participate in an oral health session on Friday 15th March in the multipurpose room.

#### **Primary School Nursing Program**

This year we will be working with Bronwyn Anderson, Visiting Primary School Nurse from DET Primary School Nursing Program. The Primary School Nursing Program is a free service offered by the Department of Education and Training (DET). It is available to all children attending government primary schools, English Language Centre Schools, Catholic and independent schools, in Victoria. It is part of a range of health and support services for school students and their families. The aim of the program is to promote child health and wellbeing and to assist in the early identification of children with potential health related difficulties. More information will be provided as we begin our work with Bronwyn. Bronwyn has kindly offered the following information about healthy teeth.

### Healthy Teeth

Did you know that tooth decay can be avoided with good dental care as well as tooth-friendly eating and drinking? Children should begin having regular dental checks from 2 years of age.

Healthy baby teeth are very important because:

- they are place holders for permanent teeth
- they can impact on a child's self esteem
- they help children eat nutritious food
- problems in baby teeth can damage the adult teeth growing underneath

If you think your child has tooth decay it is important to see a dentist to stop it from getting worse. Dental care for children is often free or low cost in the public dental system up to a certain age. Please contact your local council to find out more.
