PRINCIPAL NEWS

The last time I wrote to you I was saying how much I was looking forward to SJB's got talent on Friday. Well I was not let down and it is lovely to witness our children involved in participating in activities they are passionate about. Well done to all who contributed and thank you to Eliza Travis for her technical expertise.

On Tuesday evening we had Year 4 children and parents attend a Eucharist Sacramental Night. The night was extremely well attended and I thank Helen Mannix, Nelson Graham, Sallyanne Scicluna and Alexandra Travis for their work on the night.

This week we say goodbye to Libby Jolley who leaves us to have her first child. We ask you to keep her and her husband Mark in your prayers as they await their bundle of joy. We will miss Libby and thank her for being such a beautiful friend, colleague and mentor to our children.

Her replacement is Elena Beslis and I am excited at the prospect of having her on staff.

Over the last two weeks in the newsletter I have written about the dire straits of our parish finances and the need for our community to react before we lose our autonomy and become a shared parish. Thank you to those people who have supported us by committing to support the parish either by asking for pledge cards or offering assistance to purchase items or provide labour.

While speaking to people within our community it has come to my attention that some are unaware of how parishes are financed across Australia and think that the Catholic Church is rich and should look after themselves.

Firstly, all parishes across Australia are responsible for generating their own income. The parish must be able to support itself from within its community to be viable. If not, the parish will cease to exist. This is no different to any other church structure or franchise. If I buy a McDonalds franchise it is up to the local community to support the business not McDonalds. This may seem harsh but it is true, and as with McDonalds, they may have the assets of the buildings and fittings but these do not generate income until sold and cannot be used to pay bills.

Over the last two weeks 15 plus families have offered their support, this is much appreciated but will not be enough to support us into the future.

I will be away for the next 6 weeks as I have enrolled in a post graduate course at the Australian Catholic University in Rome. It is a three week residential program running from 8.30 to 5.00pm each day, plus four sessions running into the evening with dinner lectures.

The program will engage participants in understanding more fully the Principals mission and identity as Catholic educators and religious leaders, particularly how their mission supports the full flourishing of all learners.

ITALIAN WEBSITE:



We are excited to roll out our Italian website that has useful links to games, videos and resources that the students can engage in at home. To access the Italian SJB 2019 website, you need to go onto our school website, under LEARNING AND TEACHING > ITALIAN. The link is set at the top of the page named 'ITALIAN WEBSITE'. We have provided some further information and links to the work we are doing each term under the 'QUESTO SEMESTRE' tab. The 'IN CLASSE' tab will be a work in progress, as we aim to add students work in future.

This term we have started a whole school competition whereby classes are encouraged to use a phrase as much as possible in class.
