# There will be joy in heaven over one sinner who does penance. Scriptural context – Parables of the lost

The three parables that appear in Luke 15 are unique to the gospel of Luke — none of the other gospels use these parables. They are used by the gospel writer to further highlight a theme that runs throughout this gospel: the release and acceptance of those who are oppressed and afflicted. It stems from the declaration of Jesus' mission in Ch 4 when he reads from the scroll of Isaiah. More than any other gospel, this one portrays Jesus as having a special care and compassion for those who have been rejected by society.

#### STUDENT WELLBEING NEWS

St John Bosco has signed up to participate in **Walk to School in October** again this year, along with many other schools in Moonee Valley.

Walk to school encourages all Victorian primary school kids to walk, ride or scoot to and from school. It's a great way to help students learn healthy habits and achieve the recommended 60 minutes a day physical activity, every day. Although with these benefits, walking and riding to school reduces congestion around the school, saves on parking and helps the environment. So it's great for the whole school community.

Therefore at St John Bosco we are encouraging you to walk, ride or scoot to school as many times as possible during the month of October. Once you get to school don't forget to record your walk, ride or scoot on the calendars in your classroom as the school with the highest participation rate in Moonee Valley wins some great prizes. We were very close to being amongst the winners last year so we're keen to get there this year!

Students can also collect a challenge card next term from their Class Captains, each time you walk, ride or scoot to school you have completed one challenge, once you have completed all the challenges on the card, you will then go into the draw for many great prizes including sports store vouchers and bounce vouchers. Our SRC Lifestyle Leaders will be stamping Challenge Cards each week to help keep the motivation levels up too.

Walking part of the way is ok too. You can still participate if you live too far to walk all the way, just park a few blocks away from the school or at the Park and Walk location and walk part of the way to and from school!






# Sandpit Update


