We have held the first 2 sessions of our 2020 Prep orientations this week. It is a pleasure meeting the new families and their children who will be joining us in 2020.

Thank you to all families who completed the CEMSIS questionnaire distributed to all families, staff and students in September. Our data came back with St John Bosco's being 4% above the state average for positive endorsement from parent at 81%, 10% above for staff positive endorsement at 77% and equal with the children's response (Grades 4,5,6) at 66%. While there is still room for improvement it is nice to know we are performing at or above the average school.

Congratulations to our own Gemma Wright who won the best and fairest for Carlton in the VFLW on Friday. We are hopeful that Gemma and her twin sister Sarah will be drafted to the AFLW next month.

<u>Lk 18:1-8</u>: God will see those who cry to him vindicated.



Does this teaching about the need for continual prayer mean that God needs to be convinced of our cause? Does a one-off prayer not get heard? Is God swayed by the force of numbers? Can the prayers of ten people carry more weight than the prayers of one? All these questions miss the point of the parable. It is not God who needs our prayers, but we who have to recognise, through prayer, our need for God's mercy and gracious love. The constancy of prayer is not to convince God but to remind ourselves of our dependence upon God.

Walk to School in October is half way through and some more students have started to get on board by walking, scooting and riding to school. Our SRC Lifestyle Leaders will be giving away more House Points next Wednesday at the start of lunch to the walkers who came ready with their Challenge Cards for a sticker. Although with these benefits, walking and riding to school reduces congestion around the school, saves on parking and helps the environment. So it's great for the whole school community.


