PRINCIPAL NEWS

Thank you to everyone for their support of myself and staff throughout this term. At last night's staff meeting I was reflecting on this time last term when we spent the whole meeting planning for the students return to school on day 1 of term 3. We all know what followed surely that cannot happen again?

I have been in discussions with Father Nhan regarding sacraments and the need to make a decision about dates for each event. As we are still unsure when we will be able to have 50 or more people in the church, we have decided to set a date to make a decision about this. We will inform parents as to the dates for each sacrament by Friday 9th October.

Our assessment strategy for testing all children prior to returning to school has been tweaked due to uncertainty around the legalities of children returning to school prior to the gazetted date. Therefore, we will change the in-school assessments to online assessments. Parents will still need to book a time but it will be administered online. This is to enhance our ability to meet the individual needs of the children. Details about the booking process will be sent via See Saw today.

Questions are being asked about what is being done with the excursion, incursion and swimming levies. There are some tentative plans for incursions in Term 4 that may use some of these funds, however any family that has paid levies that have not been used will have them credited to their accounts for next year. As for the Grade 6 children, any family leaving our school will be refunded any unused amount, providing their account is not in arrears. Those Grade 6 children who have siblings in our school will have these unused funds credited to their family account. We understand that it is a difficult time financially for many in the community. If you are having any problems with the payment of fees, please contact me to discuss.

Those of you who have a child starting school next year, may be wondering about the transition program for your child. At present we have no dates regarding transition sessions. We are waiting for the kindergartens to allow us to visit your child and for primary schools to have permission for your children to visit us. We have been told by the kindergartens that we will know more at the beginning of term 4. We are hoping to start transition sessions on the week beginning October 26th but this is dependent on state government approval.

Liturgical Calendar: Twenty- Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Mt 20:1-16: Why are you jealous because I am generous? The complaining workers in today's Gospel assumed they were near the top of some unspoken hierarchy. They thought they deserved more than some of their co-workers. If we think of the earth as God's great vineyard, we can see obvious parallels today. Nations can think they deserve more than their less developed neighbours; perhaps because their economies have been industrialised longer. People can assume they are right to own multiple properties while others remain homeless; perhaps because they inherited or worked hard for them.

But we Christians are called to work in the vineyard for its good, and for the good of all, not merely ourselves. "The way humanity treats the environment influences the way it treats itself, and vice versa", declared Pope Benedict XVI in the encyclical *Caritas in Veritate*, reminding us that justice for others and good stewardship of our world are intimately connected. During this Season of Creation, we might ask ourselves: How can we tend the vineyard into which God has sent us? Do we attend to the needs of our fellow workers, especially refugees and immigrants who have only recently arrived?

As you may already be aware, Book Week for 2020 has been postponed until Week 3 of Term 4 (Monday 19th - Friday 23rd of October). As our Prep-2 students will be at school when we celebrate BookWeek, they will be undertaking activities in Literacy to engage, encounter and enjoy the various books that have been nominated for the Book Week Awards. These activities will have a strong Literacy focus, but will also involve craft, grammar, story telling, re-enacting stories, creating role plays etc just to name a few. We cannot wait to engage our students in books and the love of reading through these activities. Thursday 23rd October will be our Book Week Parade. However, due to our current circumstances, this will look very different to previous years. Instead of having a whole school parade, we will be conducting a virtual parade for our students in Years Prep-2. Each grade will parade around the multipurpose room, and we will stream their parade live to all the other classes in the school. Our students in Years 3-6 will not miss out on the fun either! We will also have these students participating in activities relating to the Book Week stories, however, this will be completed remotely. There will be many different tasks that the students will undertake at home and they will all have access to all the books digitally. Some of the activities will include role playing, creating an artistic response to the text etc. These tasks will be supported by the teachers and we cannot wait to see what the students produce. This will be a time for our students to read, explore and to just enjoy picture story texts as well as investigating strategies that authors use to engage readers of all ages.
