Inquiry Throughline: Living together in Harmony

Big question:

How has Australia's journey to democracy shaped our communities? How can we create a more inclusive and harmonious society by embracing cultural diversity?

Students will engage in the 'Research Process' to explore the concept of living together in harmony. They will investigate Australia's journey toward becoming a democratic nation, focusing on the impact this has had on Australian communities, with particular emphasis on Indigenous Australians. The unit will also delve into contemporary migration stories featured in the news, examining the cultural diversity that shapes modern Australia. Students will explore practical ways to build a more inclusive society. Through research and immersive experiences, they will deepen their understanding of the value of embracing cultural differences and work towards fostering harmonious, accepting communities.

The students will:

Spelling:
